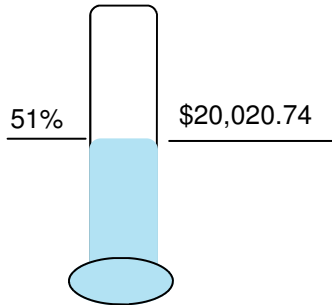

Let's Look at Beatitude # 7

"Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called children of God."

We live in a world where conflict seems to be abundant and comfortable. It is not the average citizen of any country that decides to war with another. Sadly, we are left out of that type of decision for all practical purposes. However, in our daily lives, within our personal space and extended surroundings and relationships, we have the power to influence not only ourselves, but all those around us. We can try to prevent or eliminate conflict and disharmony. We can strive to be cooperative, caring, and peaceful. Combative toward one another? Nasty campaigning exaggerates weaknesses and harms reputations in a way that may be irreversible. Why do we prefer to find weaknesses and dwell upon them rather than expand on the value of the ideas of others? Some people would rather see no acceptable solution to a problem than to accept one from someone else. Sharing ideas and thoughts in cooperative discussion only helps us progress and enable us to work and live in a harmonic environment.

If we always think about someone else's position.....if we do what Jesus has taught us....think about walking in someone else's shoes; then a calm understanding may always be the light that shines. Discussing in a peaceful, diplomatic environment can only lead to compromises and a wealth of solutions. Peacemakers are the kindly and compassionate energies in our communities. Peacemakers reach out to others through friendship. St. Gregory of Nyssa called a peacemaker "a person who brings peace to another". Sounds easy, but, one cannot give another what one does not possess oneself. God wants us to be filled with the blessings of peace and then communicate it to those who need it. Thus, we will love each other as God loves us, making us children of God.

Our faith teaches that God has created each one of us in God's own image and likeness (Genesis 1:27) and also chosen us to be God's own before the foundations of the earth (Ephesians 1:5). This essentially means that our journey through life begins and ends with God.
