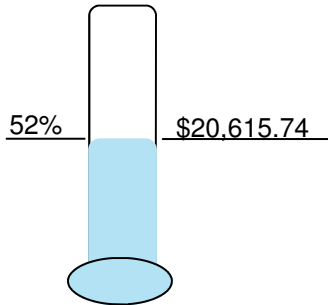

Here's a look at Beatitude # 1

Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the Kingdom of heaven.

Many religious scholars believe that this beatitude sums up all the rest. If we make this beatitude our foundation or framework in life, then, most likely, we will be living the other seven as well. Contrary to what most people think, the *poor in spirit* are not people with little or no spiritual life, or people lacking in spirituality. Instead, they are spiritual giants because they live their lives with **unconditional trust** in God. The poor in spirit clearly know and understand their absolute need for God and live their lives with total and complete belief in Him to help them grow throughout the many challenges and obstacles in everyday life.

In this beatitude, Jesus helps us understand the **value** of absolute trust in His love and care for us. Jesus reminds us again in Matthew 6:26-34 when he tells us that the key to happiness is living our lives with pure trust in His care for us. When Jesus uses the words "blessed" or "happy" He is referring to a joy that comes from living our lives in union with Him. Nothing can steal that joy or happiness from us. To what degree are you poor in spirit? To what magnitude is your confidence in God?

KENYA SCHOOL PROJECT



The Kenya School committee wishes to thank you all who have so enthusiastically supported the building of the school. Together, our commitment to “multiply the loaves and fishes,” to date has successfully raised \$12,656.50 through your donations to the annual appeal. Through your generosity a science lab will be completed for the students in Gitare to be ready when the new academic year begins in January 2015.

This year’s Form 4(Grade 12) students at St. Josephine Bakhita School will be facing many challenges as they take the government mandated science exam needed for their secondary school certificate. Laboratory facilities and science equipment although very essential for learning, are rare in many rural secondary schools in Kenya. The following excerpts from the standard online newspaper from Kenya capture the current situation in some of the schools and highlights the need for having a basic functional laboratory for our school.

BARINGO COUNTY: As Kenya Certificate Secondary Education exams kick off on Tuesday, some candidates for the first time will be coming into contact with science practical equipment since they embarked on their secondary education. And some schools this last week have been racing against time to expose their candidates with the science practical equipment which they have been forced to only theorize for the last four years for lack of science laboratories and equipment.

When *Standard on Sunday* visited Sagasagik secondary school in Baringo County on Saturday, it found teachers doing all they can to introduce the apparatus to the bewildered candidates, some of them too afraid to hold fragile apparatus like pipettes, burets and measuring cylinders for fear of breaking them. A candidate Sharon Kigen examined the apparatus delivered in carton boxes with clinical look, more puzzled at how fragile they are than how she will put into practical use during the science practicals during the examinations. "It was only this week that the apparatus were brought here in cartons and today we were allowed to have a feel of them," she said. For the last four years, the candidates have been relying on kitchen fire to heat chemicals in Bunsen burners with rain water direct from their roof tops replacing the recommended distilled water. On Saturday the school had special lesson as the candidates were exposed for the first time with hired burners, droppers, beakers, funnels, test tubes and 13kg K-gas that were set up in one of the classrooms with teachers tables converted into lab tables. "It is the first time I am coming across buret and how to read it. Theory has been the order of the day and when we entered this place on Friday I thought it was a hospital facility, it was a difficult situation for all of us," said Nancy Chebii another candidate.

The completion of the science laboratory for the St. Josephine Bakhita Secondary School means that future students will be exposed to science equipment and experiments and be better prepared for the final government examination at the end of the four years. Please remember in your prayers the Form 4 Students currently taking their exams. Once again thank you for accepting the call to be partners in “Building the future, Desk by Desk, Class by Class.”
