

Questions Catholics ask

WHAT IS THE CHURCH CALENDAR?

CHRISTIANITY, with its roots in Jewish thought and practice, adopted its sense of the sacred character of time from Israelite history. Jesus grounded the meaning of the first Eucharistic ritual in the liberation event of Passover; as a result the celebration of Easter is configured each year with the Jewish Passover, and the entire liturgical year conforms backwards and forwards from that date. The need to embrace the sacred character of all of life's seasons, both tearful and joyful, remains evident in the longing of Advent, the penitential nature of Lent, and the alleluias of Easter.

The church continues to acknowledge divine victories won over sin and death in both the Incarnation and the Paschal mysteries celebrated at Christmas and Easter. It honors the harvest of the church reaped at Pentecost and the long season dedicated to growth—both seen and unseen—in Ordinary Time.

Today's religious calendar assists in harnessing time and organizing it for optimal use. Liturgical cycles help us remember our story and the identity we bear as heirs to this history. It acknowledges the sacred character of time in witnessing to the goodness and faithfulness of God. Most of all it reminds us of the many reasons we have to give thanks.

Join His Excellency, Bishop Salvatore Matano, in Washington, D.C. at the 41st March for Life. Bishop Matano will meet with Rochester pilgrims following the 7:30AM Solemn Mass for Life at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception. Bishop Matano will also meet at 1:00PM for the start of the March on the corner of 7th and Madison at the National Gallery of Art. All Rochester pilgrims are welcome to meet.

A prayerful time of Adoration before the Blessed Sacrament for the safety and protection of all the unborn and for those who advocate for them will be held in our chapel at St. Mary's Annex in Dansville on January 22 beginning with a Communion service at 8:15am and ending with Benediction at 5pm All are welcome.

WHY MUST GODPARENTS get a certificate from their parish to be godparents but a best man or maid of honor do not? Don't they have the same sacramental obligations? The short answer is no. Both are important participants in the sacrament, but they serve different purposes and functions. In baptism, godparents or sponsors are those who present someone to the church for baptism. Their role is to help the person being baptized to develop his or her understanding and practice of the faith. They do so by their own example of faith, as well as by answering questions and helping the newly baptized become an active member of the community of the church. In the case of an infant, they assist the parents in whatever way possible to raise the child in faith. Most importantly, godparents and sponsors should pray for the newly baptized often, supporting them by their prayers. Therefore at least one godparent or sponsor must be Catholic. The other godparent can be a baptized non-Catholic and is called a Christian witness.

Witnesses to marriage do not have a spiritual obligation. Their purpose is more of a legal function. They, like the priest or deacon, are witnesses to the vows exchanged. Therefore there are no requirements concerning religion. This obviously does not prohibit the best man and maid of honor from spiritually supporting a newly married couple, but the church does not require anything more than meeting the eligibility requirements of age.
