

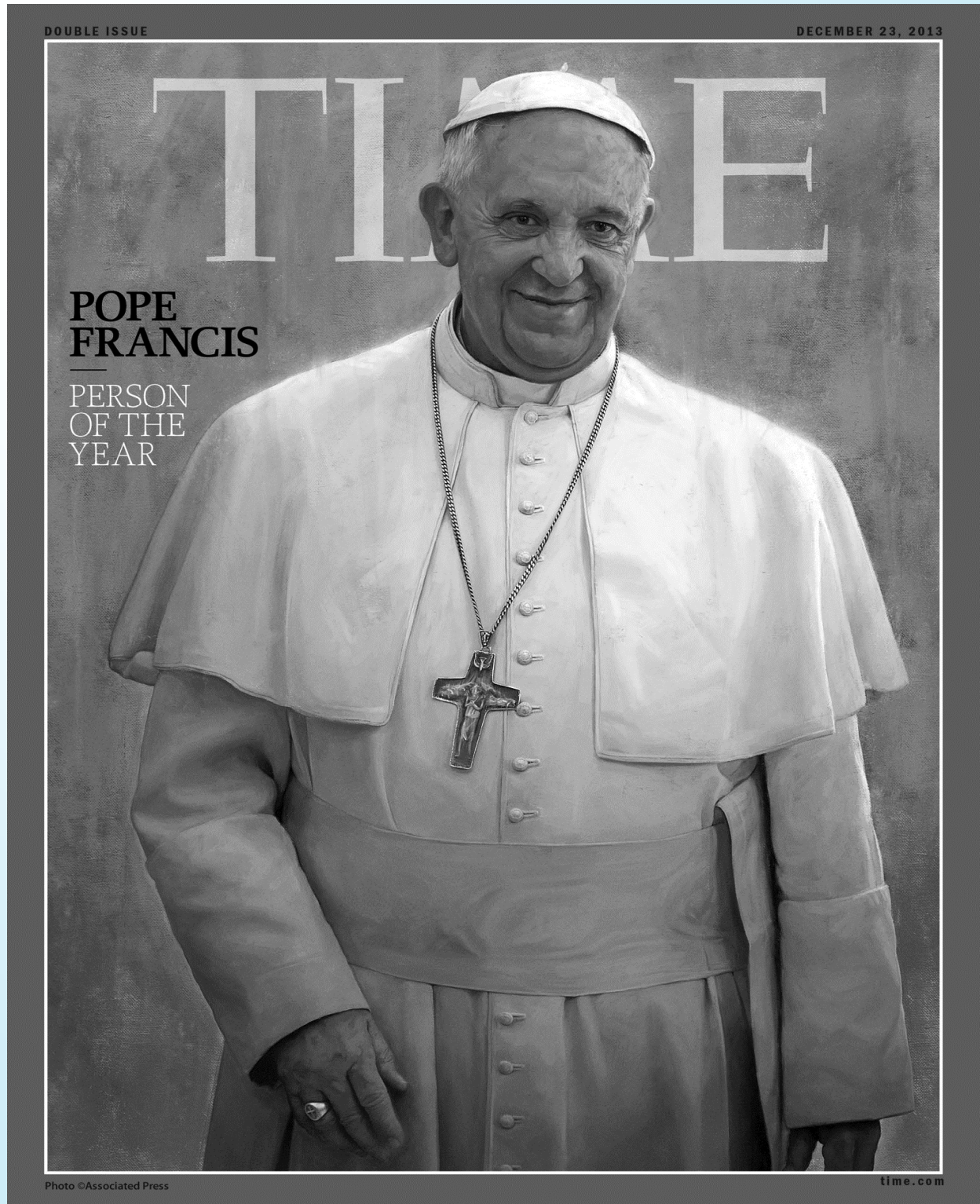



**INVEST JUST FIVE MINUTES A DAY, AND YOUR FAITH WILL DEEPEN A GROW - A DAY AT A TIME****Sunday, January 5, 2014 Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord Peace to all who enter here**

Epiphanies—"appearings"—come in all sizes: cosmic ones, like the word of God made flesh in Jesus, and more domestic kinds, like recognizing the handiwork of God in members of your own family. Today the church honors the importance of home-sweet-home by encouraging the blessing of places where families have daily opportunities to incarnate love right where they live. Gather the family. Bestow a blessing with traditional symbols: hanging a cross in the family room. Say the Lord's Prayer together for a year of peace and grace. Or create a ritual that uniquely expresses the ties that bind your family together. Today's readings: *Isaiah 60:1-6; Ephesians 3:2-3a, 5-6; Matthew 2:1-12 (20)*. "On entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage."

**Monday, January 6 Christmas weekday "In the world but not of it"**

The believer's ideal relationship to the world is often described as "in the world but not of it." The Christian spiritual tradition, however, has at times gone a bit overboard, seeing the world as so evil and full of temptation it is best to stay as separate as possible until you can leave it all behind and wait for heaven. At the other extreme, of course, people can embrace earthly life so much they forget about God—what Saint Paul called living "in the flesh." In the end it's best to recall that while we may choose to separate ourselves from God through sin, God did look at the world and see that it was good—good enough to dwell among us. Today's readings: *1 John 3:22-4:6; Matthew 4:12-17, 23-25 (212)*. "You belong to God . . . for the one who is in you is greater than the one who is in the world."

**Tuesday, January 7 Memorial of Raymond of Peñafort, priest There ought to be a law**

It's natural to complain about all the laws and regulations people must observe to live in society. Yet when those things protect us from harm, it's a different story; complaint turns to gratitude. Canon law, which Saint Raymond of Peñafort codified in the 13<sup>th</sup> century, governs the internal workings of the church and is designed to help guide and protect people from the damage they can do to themselves and others when they lose sight of their "better angels." For an online guide to understanding canon law, visit [canonlaw.info](http://canonlaw.info). Today's readings: *1 John 4:7-10; Mark 6:34-44 (213)*. "They were like sheep without a shepherd; and he began to teach them many things."

**Wednesday, January 8 Christmas weekday Come out, come out, wherever you are!**

The hymn of thanks, "For the Fruit of All Creation," concludes with the words: "Most of all that love has found us / Thanks be to God." It's a wonderful way to lay hold of the essence of Christmas even as the trees are lying lightless at the curb. While you struggle to find God and to embrace the way of Christ as a way of *daily* living, remember that the Incarnation is less about your finding God than God finding you—in spite of our favorite hiding places. Love has found you. Today's readings: *1 John 4:11-18; Mark 6:45-52 (214)*. "Beloved, if God so loved us, we also must love one another."

**Thursday, January 9 Christmas weekday Your rich relations with the poor**

A few decades ago the expression "preferential option for the poor" entered the Catholic vocabulary. The phrase points to the fact that while the Good News of Jesus goes out to the whole world, those who are poor, those most in need, receive a certain priority. Or as Pope Francis asserted in his apostolic exhortation *Evangelii Gaudium*, "The whole church . . . has to go forth to everyone without exception. But to whom should she go first? . . . Not so much our friends and wealthy neighbors, but above all the poor and the sick, those who are usually despised and overlooked." Do what you can to strengthen your bond with the poor. Today's readings: *1 John 4:19-5:4; Luke 4:14-22 (215)* "He has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor."

**Friday, January 10 Christmas weekday Clean up your act!**

"Cleanliness codes," as religious scholars call them, have been part of religions universally. Jesus, however, upset the applecart by mixing with people and foods the religious leaders of his age considered unclean. He made it clear that purity had a lot more to do with one's interior state of being than with externals and appearances. It's not enough to practice good physical hygiene, important though it is for health. Spiritual hygiene requires attention, too. Spend some time giving your soul a good scrub down—an examination of conscience in the Jesuit tradition, like *this one*, is a good place to start! Today's readings: *1 John 5:5-13; Luke 5:12-16 (216)*. "Jesus stretched out his hand, touched him, and said, 'I do will it. Be made clean.'"

**Saturday, January 11 Christmas weekday What's the meaning of life?**

"Life is worth living." That title of Catholic Archbishop Fulton Sheen's mid-20th-century television program stated a basic belief people of faith have always had: Life does have meaning and value, and it's each person's vocation to discern that purpose and pursue it. Try out this prayer of discernment: "God our Father, you have a plan for each one of us, you hold out to us a future full of hope. Give us the wisdom of your Spirit so that we can see the shape of your plan in the gifts you have given us and in the circumstances of our daily lives. Today's readings: *1 John 5:14-21; John 3:22-30 (217)*. "We . . . know that the Son of God has come and has given us discernment to know the one who is true."
