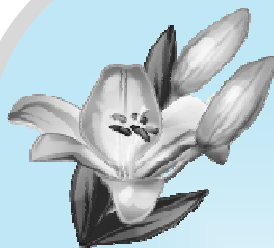

Faith starts here

In what or in whom do you trust? Money says we trust in God, but surely some of us trust in money almost as much (or perhaps more). Maybe you base your ultimate confidence in your spouse, your family, your parish community—or your country, right or wrong. My parents used to trust with an almost religious fervor in the reports of Walter Cronkite. In the same way I tend to trust a little too much in Wikipedia.

More than a few of your fellow citizens have grown too cynical to place their confidence in anything at all: not in banks, not in politicians, not in clergy, and not in stories about gods and demons. Such people could be half right in their skepticism. Much about this world *is* a scam. Losing confidence in false authorities is not a bad position from which to discover what the truth is and where genuine authority lies.

Easter Sunday asks you to look inside an empty tomb and discover your faith. You're asked to believe in *nothing*, so to speak. You're asked to do what Jesus once proposed: to happily become those who have not seen and yet believe. The empty tomb is a blank page upon which many interpretations can be written. Did "they"—did someone—take the body and put it elsewhere, as Mary Magdalene wonders in this version of the Easter events? Did disciples themselves steal the body, as the Temple authorities had feared they might? Did something else happen; something incredible; a thing that can hardly be described because it's never happened before? Did a man who was crucified, died, and was buried walk free of the tomb of his own volition?

Faith doesn't begin with baptism: If it did, the world would be bursting with faith-filled people! Faith doesn't start with fidelity to the sacraments, saying your prayers, reading your Bibles, gathering with people who give their assent to all the same morals and principles. Christian faith starts here, at the mouth of an empty tomb. It begins with an honest assessment of a negative space. You're asked to look into the void of death and to answer truthfully: What do you see there? Is that the shape of your most dreadful fears, or is it a God-shaped hole? Does the empty tomb confirm the pointlessness of your life, or is it the doorway to ultimate meaning and validation? Is the resurrection of Jesus good news for Jesus or *Good News* for human history? Did the clock stop for the gospel story on Good Friday, or did a window open on eternity?

If you're going to believe anything you say in church, you have to start here, at the empty tomb. You have to put your trust in the darkness and believe that God waits for you there.
