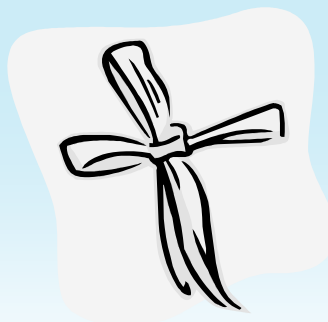

Questions Catholics ask

WHY ISN'T THE "GLORIA" SUNG DURING LENT?

A HUGE PRINCIPLE in ritual is to move up and down a sliding scale of magnificence so that it will be clear to the youngest child what's really important in the full spectrum of what the church believes. The Resurrection of Jesus is the number-one mystery Christians celebrate, so it's enhanced with three days of intense liturgy (the Triduum), a full week of solemn commemoration (Holy Week), preceded by 40 days of penitential preparation (the season of Lent). Along with prayer, fasting, and almsgiving to get ready for Easter, the church also fasts from saying or singing the word *Alleluia* as well as singing the *Gloria*.

The *Gloria* is an exalted hymn that is not to be replaced by any other at that time in the Mass, so say the norms of the Roman Missal. It adds a "celebratory character" to the Introductory Rites that is better expressed sung than in recitation, and increased in collaboration with a full choir—reminding us of its debut performance. "To sing belongs to lovers," as Saint Augustine once said. To yearn also belongs to lovers—which is why sometimes the church saves the song until its proper hour.
