**QUESTIONS CATHOLICS ASK**

**WHY IS THERE "SUNDAY" MASS ON SATURDAY?**

WHAT WE CALL the Saturday evening Mass is technically a "vigil Mass." *Vigil* comes from the Latin word to "keep watch." Christians are "vigilant"—always watching—for the Day of the Lord, a reminder that every Sunday of the year is a little Easter, as the early Fathers of the church noted.

Holy Saturday night inaugurates "the mother of all vigils" at nightfall with the lighting of the Easter fire and the sharing of the light of Christ from the paschal candle. Darkness is a necessary component of the Easter Vigil because the coming of Christ's light dispels it. Vigils sprang up before many great feasts of the church, including Christmas, Epiphany, Ascension, Pentecost, the Immaculate Conception, the Assumption, and the eight feasts of the apostles, Saint John the Baptist, All Saints, and, curiously, Saint Lawrence.

The weekly vigil Mass accompanied the liturgical reforms of Vatican II, acknowledging the pastoral needs of workers and others who cannot keep the Sunday obligation. On a deeper level, many ancient cultures perceived a "day" as lasting from sundown to sundown, including our Jewish ancestors. This perspective is recognized in the Creation story, in which "evening came, and morning followed—the first day."

16th Sunday in Ordinary Time

One of the responsibilities defined for members of the town board in my locale is that of weed commissioner. It is his job to ensure that the local ordinances on noxious weeds are enforced. This almost always means that he has to respond to a complaint from some neighbor about another resident's unkempt property. The weed commissioner doesn't really drive around looking for weeds to be exterminated. And he can't enforce any code on his own. All he can do is encourage a property owner to cut down any weeds or risk having it done for them with the cost added to next year's property tax bill. A weed commissioner probably wouldn't have been much help to the landowner in today's parable. After all, the weeds were growing among the wheat, and tearing out the weeds would have risked uprooting the crops. The consequences at that moment would have been too catastrophic to imagine for the farmer. Instead, he was willing to wait until harvest time when he would harvest the grain and burn the weeds. His patience would be rewarded with a decent crop, and he would not risk losing it all.

God is infinitely patient. Like the landowner, God is willing to wait things out, letting a person's life take its course. The consequences come at the end. Like the property owner who discovers that his tax bill at the end of the year now contains an assessment for weed removal, so too do those who spend their lives living like weeds. In the end, the bill will come due. But one important message of the parable is that God is willing to give a person time. Good and bad grow together. And God gives the sinner an opportunity to change, to seek conversion. Not everyone chooses that path. But the promise of salvation is held out for all. And thank God for that!
